Lighting of the Advent Candle

The First Candle (Candle of Hope)

Introduction by Priest:

Many churches and families use an advent wreath during the seasons of Advent and Christmas.

An Advent Wreath includes five candles; one for each Sunday leading to Christmas and a fifth candle for Christmas day. Often there are three purple and one pink candle. The purple represents repentance. The pink symbolizes joy. The central candle is called the Christ candle and is not lit until Christmas day.

The Advent Wreath includes many symbols. The Wreath is in the shape of a circle, without beginning and ending. This reminds us that there is no ending to God. God's love and care for us never ends. The evergreen branches are a sign of every day new life in Christ. The candles tell us of the light which came into the world with the coming of Jesus Christ.

The First Candle (The Candle of Prophecy/Hope):

The first candle is sometimes called the candle of prophecy because it

symbolizes the promises the prophets delivered from God; promises that

foretold Christ's birth. Also, because these prophesies held promises for the

redemption of mankind, the candle bears that symbol and is therefore called

the HOPE candle.
